Mr. Hart called the meeting to order with the following

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Minutes of the May 18, 2009 meeting were read and approved.

Minutes of the June 1, 2009 meeting were read and approved
as amended.

The financial reports were given to the Trustees.

Mr. Holman made a motion to approve the expenditures
totaling \$8,439.75. Mr. Miller seconded the motion. Roll

CORRESPONDENCE:

1. Letter from Connie Klema, Attorney at Law.

There was no Fire Co. report.

Joe Walker turned in 2 permits totaling \$100. The letter
from the prosecuting attorney to Mike O'Neil was not sent
because the property is being cleaned. The trailer by the
post office sold at the sheriffs sale and Joe Walker is
trying to get in contact with the bank to get it cleaned.
Mr. Hart said that we may need to consider declaring it a
nuisance and putting a lien on it. Mr. Walker mentioned
that the pigs were still there and he will get a hold of
Mrs. Reed to have the pigs removed. Mr. Hart suggested
that Mr. Walker give her a date to have them removed. Mr.
Walker also mentioned that the barn on Franklin Avenue is
agricultural and is exempt.

Steve Patterson mentioned that on July 8, 2009 delivered ten 8' t-bar fence post to Rolland Watson. Mr. Watson signed the receipt.

Mr. Miller thanked Steve, Rob and Charlie for the ditching and tree removal. Mr. Miller went over the roads that need to go out to bid. The Fiscal Officer will place an ad in the paper with the bids to be due the Saturday before the second meeting in August.

Mr. Hart, in response to Marshall Eubanks official complaint regarding the trolley cars and HB 50, mentioned that HB 50 does not apply to trolley or rail cars but it does apply to junk motorized vehicles. Mr. Hart did talk to the Evans Foundation and they intend to remove the cars but are not sure when. Mr. Hart told Bill Ours that if his organization was interested in removing them that he would need to contact the Evans Foundation. Mr. Hart also mentioned that The Evans Foundation will not be doing anything regarding the railroad crossings until after the court case is settled and then they will continue the contract with The Shelly Co. to pave the bike path. Mr. Hart told them that it is our position that the road be replaced to the prior condition to removing the rails regardless of who wins the court case.

Mr. Holman brought a few pictures to the meeting of various things of interest in the township that he would like on the website to show what the township has to offer and what the township is about.

Robert Snedden said that people are running on his property. Mr. Hart said that he should contact the sheriffs' office.
